Your Assignment

This unit offers you the opportunity to specialise in developing critical, creative and technical excellence in specific areas of practice and takes you further into the specific aesthetic frameworks, creative skills, and design strategies needed to produce original sound art. The aim is to provide you with ideas and methodologies for structuring your creative projects. It helps you to refresh the skills acquired in the first year and to enhance and expand upon your core practices.

You will develop excellence in specific areas of sound art practice by engaging in two of three specialist options: Spatialisation for Installation and Performance / Sound for Screen / Expanded Studio Practice for Twenty-First Century Sound Artists.

You will be supported to produce a Personal Creative Project that responds to, and is based upon, one (or two) of the options above.

You are being asked to hand in:

- **1. Personal Creative Project:** Format dependent upon choice of options (16-bit, 44.1kHz wav file/s if audio only). If in another format explain this in your report (e.g. code, video, artefact, performance, among others).
- **2. Supporting Text (pdf) (1,000 words):** This should include writing on the context and process of your creative project (800 words) and a brief paragraph at the end indicating how you might envisage a new work in a gallery scenario (200 words).
- **3. Blog Export (pdf):** This should demonstrate the context and process of your creative project (10 entries minimum with URL link to blog as well).

Please combine elements 2 and 3 of the hand into one PDF

It is recommended that you listen to your work on a variety of playback systems before handingit in to help its realisation.
Analyse and evaluate the design strategy considerations that these areas require. (Enquiry)	Your supporting text and blog should demonstrate analysis and evaluation of your process. Include evidence of your strategy and intentions and if your enquiry changed, ensure this aspect is written into your supporting text.
Conduct the research necessary for working in these areas and to communicate the results in a variety of mediums. (Communication)	Your creative project, supporting text and blog should be coherent and clearly communicated. This includes ensuring all files are labelled accordingly.
Self-assess the strengths and weaknesses of your work in these areas both from a personal and group point of view with an awareness of the issues involved in collaborative work. (Process)	You will demonstrate what your practice means to you and assess the strengths and weaknesses of your creative project within your supporting text. It is vital you share your process in your blog posts and complete the set follow-up tasks of the unit.
